

Pregnancy Care Center

Great things are happening every day at the PCC! We're seeing individual lives and generations impacted by God's grace. Already in 2018 hundreds of individuals have been impacted by this work through nearly 500 visits to the Center including 87 first time visitors. So far 33 babies have been born to women we've worked with this year. Since opening in 2009 over 1,000 men, women, and children have received compassion, hope, and help by the caring staff and volunteers at the Center. Over 425 precious baby boys and girls have been born to mothers we've served, and moms and dads have participated in over 4,000 parenting classes!

We recently added a new staff member, Rachel Armstrong. She will be our full-time Client Services Director.

Join us for our annual Walk for Life as we enjoy a fun morning together to raise funds for the Pregnancy Care Center! The money you raise directly impacts local moms, dads, babies, and students. Come rain or shine! We'll use the walking track in the gymnasium in the event of heavy rain. You will receive a fee t-shirt if you raise \$150 or more. The course is a flat two miles. Bring the whole family (no pets, please). If you cannot join us, you can walk on your own.

Rescue 1 Global

Tulip Grove Baptist Church's decision to partner with Rescue 1 Global earlier this year began with an immediate need for a survivor and her 18-month old son. They were transitioning out of a safe-house environment into their own apartment. She needed everything. We sent out an urgent request for diapers, baby wipes, food, small TV, warm clothes, shoes, rugs, blankets, furniture, etc. We delivered a trunk load of supplies and food. What a blessing! Our Rescue 1 Global (R1G) direct contact sent us a picture of the little boy sitting on the donations (with his face concealed for security purposes). The survivor and her son were so grateful!

A new house-parent is in place at Grace Oasis, and they can now begin to admit young female survivors. As you can imagine, taking care of girls 12-17 and sometimes adult females, the physical needs are great. If we can help with the physical needs then R1G can concentrate on the healing and restoring. It is R1G's goal to present each new survivor with full-size toiletries when they are brought to the Safe House. "This is your new home" is one of the first messages they strive to portray.

The MATH Class (Ben Clark's Class) held a donation drive the first of May. They collected shampoo, body wash, toothbrushes, feminine products, paper products, cleaning supplies, laundry detergent, and cash.



The MATH Class will also consider becoming a One/1000 donor later in the year. Being a One/1000 donor answers a need to support a survivor at \$50 a month. It can be a year commitment or indefinitely. The Friendship Class and Joshua 1:9 Class have already committed to the One/1000 program. The Audrain/Gables Class is considering it as a future class project as well.

A few weeks ago, we were alerted that a rescue was in progress. We were asked first to pray and then to help with an immediate need for additional groceries to feed the survivor for a week. On behalf of our TGBC Fighting Human Trafficking Team, Kevin and I responded with a trip to Kroger. We purchased everything on the list and some extra's that we used to buy when our girls were home. It was a blessing for us, but most of all TGBC answered the need.

We are so blessed to be part of a loving and generous congregation. Thank you for your generous donations and prayers. Together we can make an impact in this fight to end modern-day slavery.

Summer College Mission Trip to Clearwater Beach

It was an incredible summer in Clearwater Beach, FL! For nine weeks I got the awesome opportunity to partner with a college ministry called Cru and share the love of Christ alongside 28 other college students and 16 staff.

We jumped right into the community by getting jobs and starting to build relationships with co-workers. To reach our new friends, my team hosted community events every Saturday and weekly lessons every Monday. We also spent our Tuesdays doing beach evangelism and outreach. This looked different each week. Sometimes it consisted of initiating spiritual conversations using one of Cru's evangelism tools. Other times it was as simple as asking people to play a game of beach volleyball with us or handing out a can of soda to any beachgoer who was willing to answer a spiritual question.

Meeting and ministering to locals and those visiting this cool little town was an awesome yet challenging experience. Clearwater is a spiritually dark place, but through the opportunities God placed in our paths, we had ten people accept Christ this summer! For many of them, this was the first time they had experienced Christian community. It was amazing to see how much of an impact that had on them as well as the non-believers we met this summer.

This trip was also a time of spiritual growth for every student involved. The Lord did a lot of work on my heart through Bible study, discipleship, and fellowship. I feel very blessed that I got to grow with God in such a beautiful place this summer.

<u>Summer College Mission Trip to Japan</u>

Full. When asked to describe my summer in one word, this was my answer. Full. Full of new cultures, new smells, new foods. Full of new friends, new habits, a new language. Full of exhaustion. Full of laughter. Full of God's favor, of His grace, of watching Him work in me and through me in new ways.

This summer, I had the opportunity to serve in Nagoya, Japan for 8 weeks with the International Mission Board. Our main ministry consisted of meeting college students and inviting them to events throughout the week where we would share the gospel. This looked different each day. Some campuses were new to the long-term Nagoya team, so we would scout and prayer walk. On other campuses, we would go to the cafeteria and eat lunch while trying to engage students in conversation. Two days a week, we were volunteers at a local university in their global learning plaza. As staff members, we aided students by practicing conversational English skills with them.

After meeting new students, we would invite them to events throughout the week such as English club and ultimate frisbee games where we would share the gospel. From those conversations, we would set up lunch, dinner, or coffee meetups to talk more in depth about the gospel. We also met people by doing street English practice. The Lord was so faithful to bring us people of peace who craved more out of life, seeking a Savior they were waiting to hear about.

As college students, we have a unique time period, specially carved out, that we can dedicate to the Lord. Through the past two summers (Italy 2017 and Japan 2018), the Lord has drawn me closer to Him, allowed me to work alongside of and learn from fellow believers, and used me in ways I could never have imagined. If you are a college student, I encourage you to pray about giving next summer to missions!

Summer Medical Mission Trip to Ecuador

This summer, my wife Kristi and I joined a team who travelled to the rural village of Calshi, Ecuador to share the love of Jesus with Quechua Indians. Every day our team would drive up the mountain to set up a clinic in a church facility where we had the opportunity to serve more than 1,300 patients, hand out more than 2,000 prescriptions, and give out 375 pairs of eye glasses in four days. Nevertheless, this trip to Ecuador was much more than the numbers.

My only prior medical mission experience came without an evangelical focus, and I will admit that I struggled with the feeling of futility. The feeling that indigenous people's lives were not likely altered by the month supply of vitamins, ibuprofen, or parasite medication I might give them. However, from the first team devotion we were encouraged to look for "God sightings" – experiences of seeing God's hand at work in our encounters with these people.

The first day, I was able to listen to a Compassion child tell us about losing her father and remind her that she had a Father in heaven who loved her and would always be with her. My wife had the opportunity to work with a woman who was suffering from an acute infection due to a home-remedy abortion, listen to the shame she had, and proclaim to her that God unconditionally loves and forgives her.

The "God sightings" of the team were abounding, and in every situation, we were able to be a part of a sovereign plan simply by empathetic listening, faithful service, and speaking truth into individual lives. Moreover, only when we rest in the unconditional love Christ showed to us are we able to go share that love in our Jerusalem, in our Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Youth on Mission

With the arrival of our new student pastor, the Student Mission Ministry team has worked to transition our commitment to missions in the communities surrounding Tulip Grove.

The student ministry had a weekend filled with discipleship and missions March 24-26. Saturday they visited homes in the Caleb Chase and Plantation Walk communities. The students were split into several teams and scattered throughout the communities pulling weeds, trimming shrubs, picking up trash, cleaning leaves, and spending time with the families in the homes. We also sent out teams to take fruit to the homebound, visited multiple nursing homes where the students played games with the residents, and performed cleanup work at the Missions Mobilization Center. During this weekend the student ministry built some relationships that led to other requests. The student pastor put together a mission team of six students that showed interest in performing additional mission work. At different times throughout the spring and summer they were able to perform work for several families as a result of the contacts made during this weekend.

The student ministry leaders performed some mission training July 18 in preparation for Youth VBS where the training would be put into practice. VBS took place July 22-26, and many acts of kindness, encouragement, prayer, and gospel presentations were given throughout the week.

Several of our youth and youth workers went to serve at the Men of Valor Family Day August 4. The church family donated many items such as school supplies, back packs, bibles, and desserts which were delivered on this day. The Men of Valor staff and families were very appreciative of the items received. Several games were played, and it was a great time of fellowship with the men and their families.

Someone asked me recently "What is Women on Mission?" Here is WMU's answer to that question... "Women on Mission groups provide a relational and dynamic way for women to grow in Christ and answer His call to make disciples.
